

SIOP NI PRIVACY NOTICE

27 March 2026

Siop Ni is committed to protecting your privacy.

The statements below explain how we use information about you, how we protect your privacy and what are your rights in relation to your own information.

What is personal information?

Personal data means any data which identifies a living person. Processing personal data (collecting, storing, using, altering, sharing or destroying personal information) is governed by the UK data protection regulation.

Who are we?

Siop Ni is the data controller (contact details below). This means it decides how your personal data is processed and for what purposes.

How do we process your personal data?

Siop Ni complies with its obligations under data protection regulations by keeping personal data up to date; by storing and destroying it securely; by not collecting or retaining excessive amounts of data; by protecting personal data from loss, misuse, unauthorised access and disclosure and by ensuring that appropriate technical measures are in place to protect personal data.

Why do we need your personal information?

We need to use information about you to:

- Respond to your queries
- Provide you with information and updates
- Manage the Siop Ni project, investors and volunteers, and provide products and services

Sharing your personal data

Your personal data will be treated as strictly confidential, and will be shared only with the following:

- Third parties acting on our behalf who are helping us deliver and manage our project, products and services

Third parties are required to protect your data and comply with data protection regulation.

How the law allows us to use your information

The law allows us to use your personal information when:

- We are providing information, or products/service to you

How long do we keep your personal data?

Your data is kept for no longer than necessary in case of any complaints, legal claims, auditing queries or other requirements. For details of specific project retention dates, please contact us using the details below.

Your rights and your personal data

You have the following rights with respect to your personal data:

- The right to request a copy of the personal data which Siop Ni holds about you;
- The right to request that Siop Ni corrects any personal data if it is found to be inaccurate or out of date;
- The right to request your personal data is erased where it is no longer necessary for Siop Ni to retain such data;
- The right to request that Siop Ni provides you with your personal data and where possible, to transmit that data directly to another data controller;
- The right, where there is a dispute in relation to the accuracy or processing of your personal data, to request a restriction is placed on further processing;
- The right to object to the processing of personal data;
- The right to lodge a complaint with the Information Commissioners Office.

Transfer of data abroad

In most instances your data remains within the UK, or within the European Economic Area which is recognised in UK law as having adequate safeguards for your data protection rights.

We may transfer your personal information to countries outside the EEA or to an international organisation. Where we transfer your personal information outside the EEA, we will ensure that adequate safeguards are used to secure the data.

Where organisations or platforms that we work with operate globally or use services outside the UK we will take reasonable steps to ensure that safeguards such as a UK adequacy decision, or model contract clauses are in place to protect personal data.

Automated decision making

We do not carry out automated decision making with your personal data.

Further processing

If we wish to use your personal data for a new purpose, not covered by this Notice, then we will provide you with a new notice explaining this new use before we start the processing and setting out the relevant purposes and processing conditions. Where and whenever necessary, we will seek your prior consent to the new processing.
